The Parable of the Persistent Widow
Luke 18:1-8



The transformative power of God (RevoJution) must not just be contained within the four-walls of the church. It needs to be brought into our classrooms, campuses, companies and communities. But the plan is also not to rush out there and forcefully change our surroundings. As Romans 13:8 says, “Owe no one anything except to love one another, for he who loves another has fulfilled the law.” Every action must be done out of love.

Because everyone's love language is different (e.g. hungry man needs food, sick man needs healing), we need to PRAY! Ask God for His leading and direction. 1 John 5:14-15 (CEV) tells us, “We are certain that God will hear our prayers when we ask for what pleases him.” Asking for what pleases God’s heart is really about asking in accordance with what He would want us to do. Prayer is the key to lasting change as we bring God into the situations that we desire change in.



Mission

Pray for issues that you would like to see change in your surroundings e.g. fewer discipline cases, lower crime rates, righteousness to triumph over corruption. You'd be surprised how the atmosphere and mood of your surroundings can change when we pray to God specifically for those issues to change.
